

# The England Coast Path

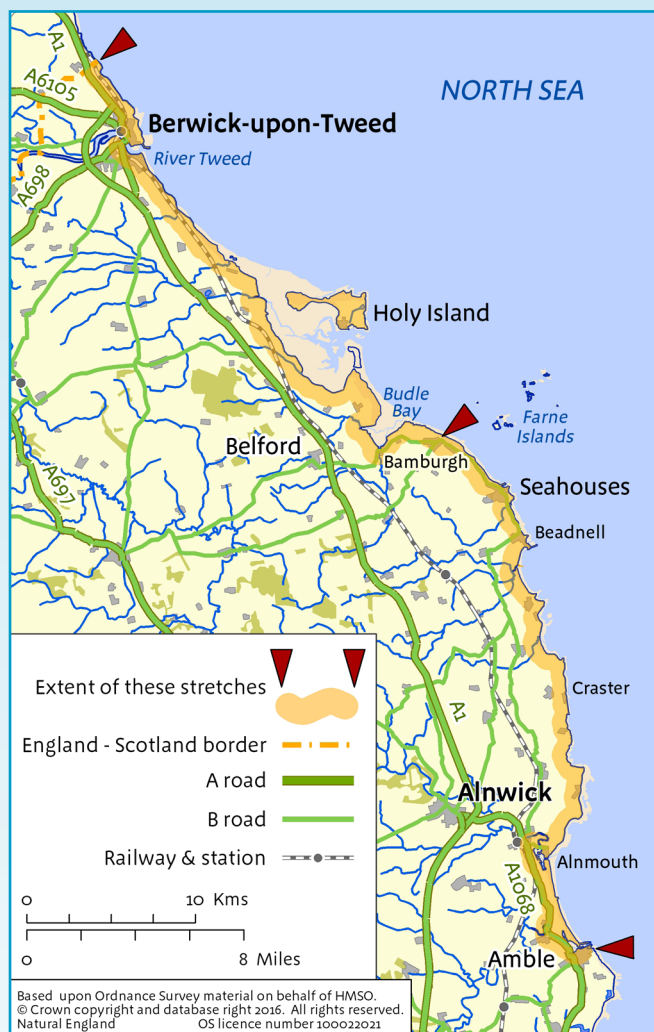
Natural England is busy implementing the England Coast Path – a new long-distance trail that, once completed, will enable people to walk around the whole English coast.

For the first time, people will have the right of access around all of our open coast. This might include foreshore, beach or cliffs but will not affect buildings or residential gardens.

In autumn 2016, Natural England started work on the 104 kilometres long stretch from Amble to the Scottish Border, including Holy Island.

Natural England is working closely with Northumberland County Council and other local stakeholders, such as Northumberland Coast AONB Partnership, to develop proposals for the route along this stretch. The initial preparation stage involves defining the extent of the coastal stretch and highlighting any potential issues, opportunities or constraints.

As part of this process, Natural England is holding public ‘drop-in’ sessions along the stretch. Anyone who believes that they may be affected by the route or who is interested in finding out more information is welcome to attend.
